

Session 3 – for leaders and facilitators

In this session, you will make two or even three decisions by consent. You have already used consent rounds in elections, now you will use consent decision-making for policy. We subsume all decisions under policy that help us govern *how* we do things. In that sense, *how* you will present rounds can be a policy decision if we assume you make a general decision. Also in this session, we will talk about aims.

This ELC will present rounds to a group of about 15 people


- Reporting on the concept of rounds

- Each (in a round) sharing their personal experience with rounds.


